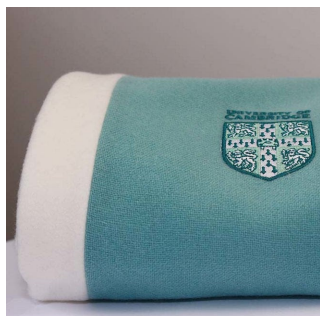
Mastercard Foundation to support young African leaders committed to climate resilience and sustainability

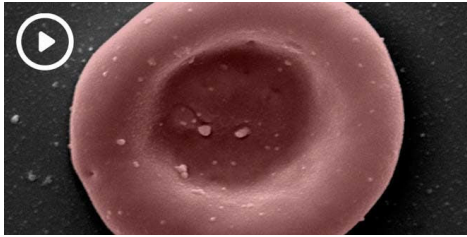
